Locate the following Grid Coordinate: A-5 Clues: 1) Florida Caverns State Park is located here. 2) This state park has the only caves open to the general public. 3) Located along the Chipola River. 4) Known as the "City of Southern Charm."	
Locate the following Grid Coordinate: E-13 Clues: 1) Bongoland was a popular roadside attraction located here. 2) Timucuan and Seminole Indians once lived here. 3) Located on the Halifax River. 4) The previous name was "Orange Port."	
Locate the following Grid Coordinate: G-11 Clues: 1) Cypress Gardens, once one of the most popular tourist sites in the state, was located here. It is now the location of Legoland. 2) Known as the "Chain of Lakes City" as there are 50+ lakes found there. 3) Twenty-four of the lakes are connected by canals.

<p>Locate the following Grid Coordinate: L-14</p> <p>Clues:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) The Serpentarium, a tourist attraction all about reptiles, was once located here. 2) This city as the nickname of the “Magic City” and the “Cruise Capital of the World.” 3) Coppertone sunscreen was invented here. 4) This city was founded by a woman, Julia Tuttle. 5) Bordered by the Everglades National Park and the Biscayne National Park. 6) The Native American meaning of the city’s name is “big water.” 	
<p>Locate the following Grid Coordinate: O-11</p> <p>Clues:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) The southernmost point of the continental U.S. can be found here. 2) This city is closer to Cuba than Tallahassee. 3) The “highway that goes over the sea” ends here.
